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The 2024 Virginia Commonwealth Games at Liberty University Main Games Weekend is featuring 18 sports this weekend, 12 of them in Lynchburg, 1 in Roanoke, 2 in Christiansburg and Chess & Shooting (Air Rifle and BB) are virtual – for a total of 15 sports in 4 days. It is sure to be a great weekend of competition and performances, including Basketball, Track & Field, Softball, Baseball, and more.

The Virginia Commonwealth Games has made it a mission to broaden its sport offering to include athletes who may have a physical and/or intellectual disability. It is important all athletes feel included and are given the opportunity to not only win a medal, but to have an unforgettable experience while participating in a sport they enjoy. In 2024, the Virginia Commonwealth Games will be hosting the Able Games composed of 8 different events: rugby, baseball, bowling, wheelchair tennis, wheelchair basketball, fishing, soccer, and track & field. As excited as we were in 2023 with the introduction of the Able Games, these 8 events will just scratch the surface. The goal is to add more opportunities each year for these amazing athletes. We look forward to the future of the Able Games. Able Fishing & Able Bowling will take place on July 18th, Wheelchair Tennis on July 19th and Able Track & Field will take place on July 20-21.

Athlete & Team check in will begin at 8am on Friday at the LaHaye Student Center leading up to the Tailgate Party and Opening Ceremonies. The Parade of Athletes will kick off at 5:30pm, leading into Opening Ceremonies, which will feature Olympic Speaker – Coach Deletha Quarles (one of the 2024 Team USA Track & Field Coaches), the newly crowned Miss VA Carlehr Swanson, the Lighting the cauldron and the official kicking off the Games. The Tailgate party will begin at 6pm following the conclusion of the Opening Ceremonies - athletes will receive their complimentary food with their Games wristband, as well as some extra goodies. There will be lots of games, activities and so much more! All of the festivities will take place from 5:30-8pm on Friday, July 19th in the LU Indoor Football Practice Facility. Both events Friday evening are free to the public and open to the community.

Main Games weekend upholds a positive reputation with the community for bolstering tourism and serving as an economic engine to the host city each year. For 35 years the Virginia Commonwealth Games have provided excellent opportunities for thousands of Virginians to develop and foster new relationships, establish new goals and personal bests, while at the same time learning teamwork, sportsmanship, as well as individual team responsibilities.
