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VA Commonwealth Games Main Games Weekend – THIS WEEKEND

Richmond, VA — The Virginia Commonwealth Games, organized by Virginia Amateur Sports (VAS), is excited to host over 3,800 athletes this weekend, Main Games Weekend.

Main Games weekend (July 24-26) will bring 8 sports to the Richmond Region, 3 throughout the rest of the Commonwealth, and 1 virtual event – Shooting – for a total of 12 sports in 4 days. It is sure to be a great weekend of competition and performances. To date, over 2,600 athletes have competed in the 2026 Games, participating in Archery, Baseball, Mini Golf, Able Baseball, Able Bowling, Disc Golf, Tennis, Wrestling, Swimming, and Triathlon.

The Parade of Athletes will kick off at 5:30 pm, leading into Opening Ceremonies, which will feature the newly crowned Miss VA, the Lighting of the Cauldron, and the official kicking off of the Games. The Tailgate Party sponsored by Experience Chesterfield will begin at 6 pm following the conclusion of the Opening Ceremonies - athletes will receive their complimentary food with their Games wristband. There will be lots of games, activities, and so much more! All of the festivities will take place from 5:30-8 pm on Friday, July 24th, at River City Sportsplex. Both events on Friday evening are free to the public and open to the community. There will be food available for the public and non-athletes to purchase, as well.

The Virginia Commonwealth Games is also proud to welcome Olympic Silver Medalist Lawrence Johnson as the featured speaker for the 2026 Opening Ceremonies on Friday, July 24. A Chesapeake, Virginia native and Virginia Sports Hall of Fame inductee, Johnson brings a career defined by NCAA records, World Championship gold, and Olympic achievement to inspire the next generation of Commonwealth Games athletes.
